The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides heating and cooling assistance to more than six million very low-income households across the country. LIHEAP is one of the first programs to start providing services right after the beginning of the fiscal year. This allows programs, especially those in the cold weather states, to quickly sign up vulnerable low income households prior to the start of the winter heating season.

As winter heating season approaches, we are concerned that any delay in releasing program funds will cause unnecessary hardships to the households that we serve. Thus, we are writing to respectfully request that the Department of Health and Human Services release LIHEAP funds at the same level as provided in FY 2014 as quickly as possible in order to allow the program to provide services to address immediate needs as the winter heating season gets underway.
